### AN ACT

To require an exercise related to terrorist and foreign fighter travel, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Terrorist and Foreign
- 5 Fighter Travel Exercise Act of 2019".

SEC. 2. EXERCISE ON TERRORIST AND FOREIGN FIGHTER

#### 2 TRAVEL. 3 (a) IN GENERAL.—In addition to, or as part of exercise programs currently carried out by the Department of 4 5 Homeland Security, to enhance domestic preparedness for and collective response to terrorism, promote the dissemi-6 7 nation of homeland security information, and test the security posture of the United States, the Secretary of 9 Homeland Security, through appropriate offices and com-10 ponents of the Department and in coordination with the 11 heads of appropriate Federal departments and agencies, shall develop and conduct an exercise related to the detec-12 13 tion and prevention of terrorist and foreign fighter travel. 14 (b) Exercise Requirements.—The exercise re-15 quired under subsection (a) shall include— 16 (1) a scenario involving— 17 (A) persons traveling from the United 18 States to join or provide material support or re-19 sources to a terrorist organization abroad; and 20 (B) terrorist infiltration into the United 21 States, including by United States citizens and 22 foreign nationals; 23 (2) coordination with appropriate Federal de-24 partments and agencies, foreign governments, and State, local, Tribal, and territorial agencies, includ-25

- 1 ing law enforcement agencies and representatives
- 2 from the National Network of Fusion Centers; and
- 3 (3) coordination with appropriate private sector
- 4 and community stakeholders.
- 5 (c) Report.—Not later than 60 days after the com-
- 6 pletion of the exercise required under subsection (a), the
- 7 Secretary of Homeland Security shall, consistent with the
- 8 protection of classified information, submit to the Com-
- 9 mittee on Homeland Security of the House of Representa-
- 10 tives and the Committee on Homeland Security and Gov-
- 11 ernmental Affairs of the Senate an after-action report pre-
- 12 senting the initial findings of such exercise, plans for
- 13 quickly incorporating lessons learned into future oper-
- 14 ations of the Department of Homeland Security, and any
- 15 proposed legislative changes informed by such exercise.
- 16 (d) Definition.—In this section, the term "material
- 17 support or resources" has the meaning given such term
- 18 in section 2339A of title 18, United States Code.
- 19 SEC. 3. EMERGING THREATS IN THE NATIONAL EXERCISE
- 20 **PROGRAM.**
- Clause (i) of section 648(b)(2)(A) of the Post-
- 22 Katrina Emergency Management Reform Act of 2006 (6
- 23 U.S.C. 748(b)(2)) is amended by inserting "and emerg-
- 24 ing" after "credible".

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
