## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Vehicle Laws - Injury or Death of Vulnerable Individual - Penalties

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from causing the serious physical injury or death 4 of a vulnerable individual as a result of the person operating a vehicle in a careless 5 or distracted manner or in violation of certain provisions of the Maryland Vehicle 6 Law; establishing certain penalties for a violation of this Act; establishing that a 7 person charged with a violation of this Act must appear in court and may not prepay 8 the fine; requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to suspend for a certain amount 9 of time the driver's license of a person convicted of a violation of this Act; defining the term "vulnerable individual" for purposes of this Act; and generally relating to 10 11 penalties for causing the serious physical injury or death of a vulnerable individual.
