#### A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Maryland Department of Health – Residential Service Agencies – Training Requirements

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring each residential service agency to ensure that certain  $\mathbf{5}$ individuals receive certain training relating to dementia; requiring each residential 6 service agency to ensure that individuals providing certain training have certain 7 experience and have completed certain training; prohibiting a residential service 8 agency from requiring certain individuals to complete certain training; requiring an 9 individual who provides certain training to issue a certification of completion to each 10 individual who completes the training; requiring the Maryland Department of 11 Health to provide a certain list of training programs to each residential service 12agency; requiring certain individuals who have not received certain training to 13 complete certain training on or before a certain date; and generally relating to 14 residential service agencies.

- 25 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
  26 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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1 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "SUPERVISORY STAFF" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO 2 SUPERVISES DIRECT CARE STAFF.

3 (B) EACH RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY SHALL ENSURE THAT:

4 (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, 5 WITHIN 45 DAYS AFTER AN INDIVIDUAL'S START OF EMPLOYMENT AS PART OF THE 6 RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY'S DIRECT CARE OR SUPERVISORY STAFF, THE 7 INDIVIDUAL IS TRAINED TO PROVIDE THE CARE REQUIRED BY THE CLIENTS OF THE 8 RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY BY, AT A MINIMUM, PROVIDING:

- 9 (I) FOR DIRECT CARE STAFF, 6 HOURS OF ONLINE OR 10 IN-PERSON TRAINING REGARDING DEMENTIA, INCLUDING TRAINING REGARDING:
- 11 **1.** ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND DEMENTIA;
  - 2. PERSON-CENTERED CARE;
  - **3.** Assessment and care planning;
  - 4. **ACTIVITIES OF DAILY LIVING; AND**
- 155.DEMENTIA-RELATEDBEHAVIORSAND16COMMUNICATION;
- 17 (II) FOR SUPERVISORY STAFF, 6 HOURS OF ONLINE OR 18 IN-PERSON TRAINING REGARDING DEMENTIA, INCLUDING TRAINING REGARDING:
- 19 **1. MEDICAL MANAGEMENT, INFORMATION, EDUCATION,**
- 20 AND SUPPORT;

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- 2. STAFFING;
- 22 **3.** SUPPORTIVE AND THERAPEUTIC ENVIRONMENTS;
  - 4. TRANSITIONS; AND
- 24 **5.** COORDINATION OF SERVICES; AND

(2) EACH MEMBER OF THE RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY'S DIRECT
 CARE OR SUPERVISORY STAFF RECEIVES 4 HOURS OF ONLINE OR IN-PERSON
 CONTINUING EDUCATION TRAINING REGARDING DEMENTIA EACH CALENDAR YEAR;
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1 (3) THE INDIVIDUAL PROVIDING THE TRAINING REQUIRED UNDER 2 ITEM (1) OR (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION HAS:

3 (I) AT LEAST 2 YEARS OF WORK EXPERIENCE RELATED TO
 4 ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE OR OTHER DEMENTIA, HEALTH CARE, GERONTOLOGY, OR A
 5 RELATED FIELD; AND

6 (II) COMPLETED AT LEAST THE MINIMUM TRAINING REQUIRED 7 UNDER ITEM (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

8 (C) A RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY MAY NOT REQUIRE AN INDIVIDUAL TO 9 COMPLETE THE TRAINING DESCRIBED UNDER SUBSECTION (B)(1) OR (2) OF THIS 10 SECTION IF THE INDIVIDUAL HAS PROVIDED DEMENTIA-RELATED DIRECT CARE OR 11 SUPERVISORY SERVICES FOR AT LEAST 24 CONSECUTIVE MONTHS BEFORE 12 BEGINNING EMPLOYMENT WITH THE RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY.

13(D) AN INDIVIDUAL PROVIDING THE TRAINING DESCRIBED UNDER14SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION SHALL ISSUE A CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION TO15EACH INDIVIDUAL WHO COMPLETES THE TRAINING.

16 **(E)** THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE TO EACH RESIDENTIAL SERVICE 17 AGENCY A LIST OF TRAINING PROGRAMS THAT PROVIDE TRAINING DESCRIBED 18 UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION TO ENSURE THAT THE TRAINING 19 REFLECTS EVIDENCE–BASED PRACTICE IN THE CARE AND TREATMENT OF 20 INDIVIDUALS EXPERIENCING ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE OR RELATED DEMENTIA.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That an individual employed as part of a residential service agency's direct care of supervisory staff on October 1, 2020, who has not received training that is equivalent to the training described under § 19–4A–03.1(b)(1) of the Health – General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, shall complete the training required under § 19–4A–03.1(b)(1) of the Health – General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, on or before December 31, 2020.

27 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 28 October 1, 2020.

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
