A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Education – School Construction – Pedestrian Safety Plans

FOR the purpose of requiring a county board of education seeking State funds for the construction of a new school, or the renovation of or an addition to an existing school that would increase the capacity by more than a certain number of students, to submit a pedestrian safety plan to the Interagency Commission on School Construction; providing for the contents of a pedestrian safety plan; authorizing the Interagency Commission to adopt regulations to implement this Act; and generally relating to pedestrian safety plans for schools.
