### A BILL

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To amend the Federal share of the fishing safety standards grants.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. 4 This Act may be cited as the "Funding Instruction for 5 Safety, Health, and Security Avoids Fishing Emergencies 6 Act" or the "FISH SAFE Act". 7 SEC. 2. AMENDMENT OF FEDERAL SHARE OF THE FISHING 8 SAFETY STANDARDS GRANTS. 9 (a) AMENDMENT.—Section 4502 of title 46, United 10 States Code, is amended— 11 (1) in subsection (i)(3), by striking "50" and in-12 serting "75"; and 13 (2) in subsection (j)(3), by striking "50" and in-14 serting "75". 15 (b) RETROACTIVE EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by subsection (a) takes effect on the day after the date 16 of enactment of the Frank LoBiondo Coast Guard Author-17 ization Act of 2018 (Public Law 115–282). 18 19 SEC. 3. COST SHARE. 20 The cap on the Federal share of the cost of any activity 21 carried out with a grant under subsections (i) and (j) of 22 section 4502 of title 46, United States Code, as in effect 23 prior to the date of enactment of the Frank LoBiondo Coast 24 Guard Authorization Act of 2018 (Public Law 115–282),

25 shall apply to any funds appropriated under the Consoli-

1	dated Appropriations Act, 2017 (Public Law 115–31) for
2	the purpose of making such grants.
3	SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS AMEND-
4	MENTS.
5	Section 4502 of title 46, United States Code, is amend-
6	ed—
7	(1) in subsection (i)(4), by striking "2019" and
8	inserting "2021"; and
9	(2) in subsection (j)(4), by striking "2019" and
10	inserting "2021".
11	SEC. 5. AIDS TO NAVIGATION.
12	(a) Section 541 of title 14, United States Code, is
13	amended—
14	(1) by striking "In" and inserting "(a) In"; and
15	(2) by adding at the end the following:
16	"(b) In the case of pierhead beacons, the Commandant
17	may—
18	"(1) acquire, by donation or purchase in behalf
19	of the United States, the right to use and occupy sites
20	for pierhead beacons; and
21	"(2) properly mark all pierheads belonging to
22	the United States situated on the northern and north-
23	western lakes, whenever the Commandant is duly no-
24	tified by the department charged with the construc-

tion or repair of pierheads that the construction or re pair of any such pierheads has been completed.".
 (b) Subchapter III of chapter 5 of title 14, United
 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following:
 **"§548. Prohibition against officers and employees** being interested in contracts for mate rials, etc.

8 "No officer, enlisted member, or civilian member of the 9 Coast Guard in any manner connected with the construc-10 tion, operation, or maintenance of lighthouses, shall be interested, either directly or indirectly, in any contract for 11 labor, materials, or supplies for the construction, operation, 12 13 or maintenance of lighthouses, or in any patent, plan, or mode of construction or illumination, or in any article of 14 15 supply for the construction, operation, or maintenance of 16 *lighthouses*.

## 17 "§549. Lighthouse and other sites; necessity and suffi18 ciency of cession by State of jurisdiction

19 "(a) No lighthouse, beacon, public pier, or landmark,
20 shall be built or erected on any site until cession of jurisdic21 tion over the same has been made to the United States.

22 "(b) For the purposes of subsection (a), a cession by23 a State of jurisdiction over a place selected as the site of24 a lighthouse, or other structure or work referred to in sub-25 section (a), shall be deemed sufficient if the cession contains

a reservation that process issued under authority of such
 State may continue to be served within such place.

3 "(c) If no reservation of service described in subsection
4 (b) is contained in a cession, all process may be served and
5 executed within the place ceded, in the same manner as if
6 no cession had been made.

#### 7 "§550. Marking pierheads in certain lakes

8 "The Commandant of the Coast Guard shall properly 9 mark all pierheads belonging to the United States situated 10 on the northern and northwestern lakes, whenever he is duly 11 notified by the department charged with the construction 12 or repair of pierheads that the construction or repair of 13 any such pierhead has been completed.".

(c) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
for chapter 5 of title 14, United States Code, is amended
by inserting after the item relating to section 547 the following:

"550. Marking pierheads in certain lakes.".

## 18 SEC. 6. TRANSFERS RELATED TO EMPLOYEES OF THE19LIGHTHOUSE SERVICE.

20 (a) Section 6 of chapter 103 of the Act of June 20,
21 1918 (33 U.S.C. 763) is repealed.

22 (b) Subchapter II of chapter 25 of title 14, United

23 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following:

"549. Lighthouse and other sites; necessity and sufficiency of cession by State of jurisdiction.

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### 1 "§2532. Retirement of employees

2	"(a) Optional Retirement.—Except as provided in
3	subsections (d) and (e), a covered employee may retire from
4	further performance of duty if such officer or employee—
5	"(1) has completed 30 years of active service in
6	the Government and is at least 55 years of age;
7	"(2) has completed 25 years of active service in
8	the Government and is at least 62 years of age; or
9	"(3) is involuntarily separated from further per-
10	formance of duty, except by removal for cause on
11	charges of misconduct or delinquency, after com-
12	pleting 25 years of active service in the Government,
13	or after completing 20 years of such service and if
14	such employee is at least 50 years of age.
15	"(b) Compulsory Retirement.—A covered employee
16	who becomes 70 years of age shall be compulsorily retired
17	from further performance of duty.
18	"(c) Retirement for Disability.—
19	"(1) IN GENERAL.—A covered employee who has
20	completed 15 years of active service in the Govern-
21	ment and is found, after examination by a medical
22	officer of the United States, to be disabled for useful
23	and efficient service by reason of disease or injury not
24	due to vicious habits, intemperance, or willful mis-
25	conduct of such officer or employee, shall be retired.

1	"(2) RESTORATION TO ACTIVE DUTY.—Any indi-
2	vidual retired under paragraph (1) may, upon recov-
3	ery, be restored to active duty, and shall from time
4	to time, before reaching the age at which such indi-
5	vidual may retire under subsection (a), be reexamined
6	by a medical officer of the United States upon the re-
7	quest of the Secretary of the department in which the
8	Coast Guard is operating.
9	"(d) Annual Compensation.—
10	"(1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para-
11	graph (2), The annual compensation of a person re-
12	tired under this section shall be a sum equal to one-
13	fortieth of the average annual pay received for the last
14	three years of service for each year of active service
15	in the Lighthouse Service, or in a department or
16	branch of the Government having a retirement sys-
17	tem, not to exceed thirty-fortieths of such average an-
18	nual pay received.
19	"(2) Retirement before 55.—The retirement
20	pay computed under paragraph (1) for any officer or
21	employee retiring under this section shall be reduced

by one-sixth of 1 percent for each full month the officer or employee is under 55 years of age at the date

24 *of retirement.* 

1	"(3) NO ALLOWANCE OR SUBSISTENCE.—Retire-
2	ment pay under this section shall not include any
3	amount on account of subsistence or other allowance.
4	"(e) EXCEPTION.—The retirement and pay provision
5	in this section shall not apply to—
6	"(1) any person in the field service of the Light-
7	house Service whose duties do not require substan-
8	tially all their time; or
9	"(2) persons of the Coast Guard.
10	"(f) WAIVER.—Any person entitled to retirement pay
11	under this section may decline to accept all or any part
12	of such retirement pay by a waiver signed and filed with
13	the Secretary of the Treasury. Such waiver may be revoked
14	in writing at any time, but no payment of the retirement
15	pay waived shall be made covering the period during which
16	such waiver was in effect.
17	((g) DEFINITION.—For the purposes of this section, the
18	term 'covered employee' means an officer or employee en-
19	gaged in the field service or on vessels of the Lighthouse
20	Service, except a person continuously employed in district
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21 offices or shop.".

7 "The Secretary of the department in which the Coast
8 Guard is operating shall pay \$100 per month to the sur9 viving spouse of a current or former employee of the Light10 house Service in accordance with section 2532 if such em11 ployee dies—

12 "(1) at a time when such employee was receiving
13 or was entitled to receive retirement pay under this
14 subchapter; or

15 "(2) from non-service-connected causes after fif16 teen or more years of employment in such service.".

19 (1) Subchapter II of chapter 25 of title 14,

5	(B) Section $2534(a)$ , as so redesignated, trans-

6 ferred, and amended is further amended by striking
7 "this Act" and inserting "section 2533".
8 (3)(A) Section 4 of chapter 761 of the Act of Au-

9 gust 19, 1950 (33 U.S.C. 774), is redesignated as sec10 tion 2534(b) of title 14, United States Code, trans11 ferred to appear after section 2534(a) of that title,
12 and amended so that the enumerator, section heading,

(B) Section 2534(b), as so redesignated, transferred, and amended is further amended by striking

title V of division C of Public Law 112–74 (33 U.S.C.
776) is redesignated as section 2534(c) of title 14,
United States Code, transferred to appear after section 2534(b) of that title, and amended so that the
enumerator, section heading, typeface, and typestyle

1	conform to those appearing in other sections in title
2	14, United States Code.
3	(B) Section 2534(c), as so redesignated, trans-
4	ferred, and amended is further amended by striking
5	"the Act of May 29, 1944, and the Act of August 19,
6	1950 (33 U.S.C. 771-775)," and inserting "section
7	2533".
8	(c) Conforming Amendment.—The table of sections
9	for chapter 25 of title 14, United States Code, is further
10	amended by inserting after the item relating to section 2532
11	the following:

4 (b) SAVINGS.—

5 (1) Notwithstanding any repeals made by this
6 section, any individual beneficiary currently receiv7 ing payments under the authority of any provisions
8 repealed in this section shall continue to receive such
9 benefits.

10 (2) Notwithstanding the repeals made under
11 paragraphs (10) and (11) of subsection (a), any pay
12 increases made under chapter 788 of the Act of Octo13 ber 29, 1949, and chapter 524 of the Act of July 9,
14 1956, as in effect prior to their repeal shall remain
15 in effect.
