- To transfer the responsibility of verifying small business concerns owned and controlled by veterans or service-disabled veterans to the Small Business Administration, and for other purposes.

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.

- 4 Adjustment Act" or the "VA–SBA Act".

7 SEC. 2. TRANSFER DATE.

8 For purposes of this Act, the term "transfer date" 9 means the date that is 2 years after the date of enactment 10 of this Act, except that such date may be extended an un-11 limited number of times by a period of not more than 6 months if the Administrator of the Small Business Admin-12 13 istration and the Secretary of Veterans Affairs jointly issue a notice to Congress and the Law Revision Counsel 14 15 of the House of Representatives containing—

1 (2) the rationale for and the length of such ex-2 tension; and 3 (3) a plan to comply with the requirements of 4 this Act within the timeframe of the extension. 5 SEC. 3. The amount of any such reim-4 bursement shall be determined jointly by the Secretary 5 and the Administrator and shall be provided from fees collected by the Secretary under multiple-award schedule 6 7 contracts. Any disagreement about the amount shall be 8 resolved by the Director of the Office of Management and 9 Budget."; and

10 (5) subsection (l) (relating to definitions), as so
11 redesignated, by adding at the end the following:
12 "(4) The term Administrator means the Admin13 istrator of the Small Business Administration.".

14 (b) TRANSFER OF REQUIREMENTS RELATING TO 15 DATABASE TO THE SMALL BUSINESS ACT.—Effective on the transfer date, subsection (f) of section 8127 of title 16 17 38, United States Code (as amended by subsection (a)), is transferred to section 36 of the Small Business Act (15) 18 U.S.C. 657f), inserted so as to appear after subsection (e). 19 20 Conforming Amendments.—The following (c)21 amendments shall take effect on the transfer date:

7 SEC. 4. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR DATABASE.

8 (a) ADMINISTRATION ACCESS TO DATABASE BEFORE 9 THE TRANSFER DATE.—During the period between the 10 date of the enactment of this Act and the transfer date, 11 the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall provide the Admin-12 istrator of the Small Business Administration with access 13 to the contents of the database described under section 14 8127(f) of title 38, United States Code.

(b) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this Actor the amendments made by this Act may be construed—

(1) as prohibiting the Administrator of the
Small Business Administration from combining the
contents of the database described under section
8127(f) of title 38, United States Code, with other
databases maintained by the Administration; or

(2) as requiring the Administrator to use any
system or technology related to the database described under section 8127(f) of title 38, United
States Code, on or after the transfer date to comply

1 with the requirement to maintain a database under 2 subsection (f) of section 36 of the Small Business 3 Act (as transferred pursuant to section 3(b) of this 4 Act). 5 (c) RECOGNITION OF THE ISSUANCE OF JOINT REG-ULATIONS.—The date specified under section 1832(e) of 6 7 the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 8 2017 (15 U.S.C. 632 note) shall be deemed to be October 9 1, 2018. 10 SEC. 5. PROCUREMENT PROGRAM FOR SMALL BUSINESS 11 CONCERNS OWNED AND CONTROLLED BY 12 SERVICE-DISABLED VETERANS. (a) PROCUREMENT PROGRAM FOR SMALL BUSINESS 13 CONCERNS OWNED AND CONTROLLED BY SERVICE-DIS-14 15 ABLED VETERANS.—Section 36 of the Small Business Act 16 (15 U.S.C. 657f) is amended— 17 (1) by striking subsections (d) and (e); 18 (2) by redesignating subsections (a), (b), and 19 (c) as subsections (c), (d), and (e) respectively; 20 (3) by inserting before subsection (c), as so re-21 designated, the following: 22 "(a) Contracting Officer Defined.—For pur-23 poses of this section, the term 'contracting officer' has the 24 meaning given such term in section 2101 of title 41, United States Code. 25

"(b) CERTIFICATION OF SMALL BUSINESS CON CERNS OWNED AND CONTROLLED BY SERVICE-DISABLED
 VETERANS.—With respect to a procurement program or
 preference established under this Act that applies to prime
 contractors, the Administrator shall—

6 "(1) certify the status of the concern as a
7 'small business concern owned and controlled by
8 service-disabled veterans'; and

9 "(2) require the periodic recertification of such
10 status.";

(4) in subsection (d), as so redesignated, by striking "and that the award can be made at a fair market price" and inserting ", that the award can be made at a fair market price, and if each concern is certified by the Administrator as a small business concern owned and controlled by service-disabled veterans"; and

18 (5) by adding at the end the following:

19 "(g) CERTIFICATION **REQUIREMENT.**—Notwithstanding subsection (c), a contracting officer may only 20 21 award a sole source contract to a small business concern 22 owned and controlled by service-disabled veterans or a 23 contract on the basis of competition restricted to small 24 business concerns owned and controlled by service-disabled 25 veterans if such a concern is certified by the Administrator 1 as a small business concern owned and controlled by serv-2 ice-disabled veterans.

- 3 "(h) Enforcement; Penalties.—
- 4 "(1) VERIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY.—In car5 rying out this section, the Administrator shall estab6 lish procedures relating to—

"(A) the filing, investigation, and disposi-7 8 tion by the Administration of any challenge to 9 the eligibility of a small business concern to receive assistance under this section (including a 10 11 challenge, filed by an interested party, relating 12 to the veracity of a certification made or infor-13 mation provided to the Administration by a 14 small business concern under subsection (b)); 15 and

"(B) verification by the Administrator of
the accuracy of any certification made or information provided to the Administration by a
small business concern under subsection (b).

20 "(2) EXAMINATIONS.—

21 "(A) EXAMINATION OF APPLICANTS.—The
22 procedures established under paragraph (1)
23 shall provide for a program of examinations by
24 the Administrator of any small business concern
25 making a certification or providing information

to the Administrator under subsection (b), to determine the veracity of any statements or information provided as part of such certification or otherwise provided under subsection (b).

"(B) EXAMINATION OF CERTIFIED CON-5 6 CERNS.—The procedures established under 7 paragraph (1) shall provide for the examination 8 of risk-based samples of small business con-9 cerns certified under subsection (b), or of any 10 small business concern that the Administrator 11 believes poses a particular risk or with respect 12 to which the Administrator receives specific and 13 credible information alleging that the small 14 business concern no longer meets eligibility re-15 quirements to be certified as a small business concern owned and controlled by service-dis-16 17 abled veterans.

18 "(3) PENALTIES.—In addition to the penalties 19 described in section 16(d), any small business con-20 cern that is determined by the Administrator to have 21 misrepresented the status of that concern as a small 22 business concern owned and controlled by service-23 disabled veterans for purposes of subsection (b), 24 shall be subject to—

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1	"(A) section 1001 of title 18, United
2	States Code;
3	"(B) sections 3729 through 3733 of title
4	31, United States Code; and
5	"(C) section 8127(g) of title 38, United
6	States Code.
7	"(i) Provision of Data.—Upon the request of the
8	Administrator, the head of any Federal department or
9	agency shall promptly provide to the Administrator such
10	information as the Administrator determines to be nec-
11	essary to carry out subsection (b) or to be able to certify
12	the status of the concern as a small business concern
13	owned and controlled by veterans under section 36A.".
14	(b) Penalties for Misrepresentation.—Section
15	16 of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 645) is amend-
16	ed—
17	(1) in subsection $(d)(1)$ —
18	(A) by striking ", a" and inserting ", a

5	SEC. 6. CERTIFICATION FOR SMALL BUSINESS CONCERNS
6	OWNED AND CONTROLLED BY VETERANS.
7	The Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 631 et seq.) is
8	amended by inserting after section 36 the following new
9	section:
10	"SEC. 36A. CERTIFICATION OF SMALL BUSINESS CONCERNS
11	OWNED AND CONTROLLED BY VETERANS.
12	"(a) IN GENERAL.—With respect to the program es-
13	tablished under section 8127 of title 38, United States
14	Code, the Administrator shall—
15	((1) certify the status of the concern as a
16	'small business concern owned and controlled by vet-
17	erans'; and
18	((2)) require the periodic recertification of such
19	status.
20	"(b) Enforcement; Penalties.—
21	"(1) VERIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY.—In car-
22	rying out this section, the Administrator shall estab-
23	lish procedures relating to—
24	"(A) the filing, investigation, and disposi-
25	tion by the Administration of any challenge to

the eligibility of a small business concern to re-

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2 ceive assistance under this section (including a 3 challenge, filed by an interested party, relating 4 to the veracity of a certification made or information provided to the Administration by a 5 6 small business concern under subsection (a)); 7 and "(B) verification by the Administrator of 8 9 the accuracy of any certification made or infor-10 mation provided to the Administration by a 11 small business concern under subsection (a). 12 "(2) EXAMINATION OF APPLICANTS.—The pro-13 cedures established under paragraph (1) shall pro-14 vide for a program of examinations by the Adminis-15 trator of any small business concern making a cer-16 tification or providing information to the Adminis-17 trator under subsection (a), to determine the verac-18 ity of any statements or information provided as 19 part of such certification or otherwise provided 20 under subsection (a). "(3) PENALTIES.—In addition to the penalties 21 22 described in section 16(d), any small business con-

cern that is determined by the Administrator to have 24 misrepresented the status of that concern as a small

9	SEC. 7. STATUS OF SELF-CERTIFIED SMALL BUSINESS CON-
10	CERNS OWNED AND CONTROLLED BY SERV-
11	ICE-DISABLED VETERANS.
12	(a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
13	sion of law, any small business concern that self-certified
14	as a small business concern owned and controlled by serv-
15	ice-disabled veterans shall—
16	(1) if the concern files a certification applica-
17	tion with the Administrator of the Small Business
18	Administration before the end of the 1-year period
19	beginning on the transfer date, maintain such self-
20	certification until the Administrator makes a deter-
21	mination with respect to such certification; and
22	(2) if the concern does not file such a certifi-
23	cation application before the end of the 1-year pe-
24	riod beginning on the transfer date, lose, at the end
25	of such 1-year period, any self-certification of the

concern as a small business concern owned and con trolled by service-disabled veterans.

3 (b) NON-APPLICABILITY TO DEPARTMENT OF VET4 ERANS AFFAIRS.—Subsection (a) shall not apply to par5 ticipation in contracts (including subcontracts) with the
6 Department of Veterans Affairs.

7 (c) NOTICE.—The Administrator shall notify any 8 small business concern that self-certified as a small busi-9 ness concern owned and controlled by service-disabled vet-10 erans about the requirements of this Act, including the 11 transfer date and any extension of such transfer date 12 made pursuant to section 2, and make such notice publicly 13 available, on—

(1) the date of the enactment of this Act; and
(2) the date on which an extension described
under section 2 is approved.

17 SEC. 8. TRANSFER OF THE CENTER FOR VERIFICATION
18 AND EVALUATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
19 VETERANS AFFAIRS TO THE SMALL BUSI20 NESS ADMINISTRATION.

(a) ABOLISHMENT.—The Center for Verification and
Evaluation of the Department of Veterans Affairs defined
under section 74.1 of title 38, Code of Federal Regulations, is abolished effective on the transfer date.

(b) TRANSFER OF FUNCTIONS.—All functions that,
 immediately before the effective date of this section, were
 functions of the Center for Verification and Evaluation
 shall—

5 (1) on the date of enactment of this Act, be 6 functions of both the Center for Verification and 7 Evaluation and the Small Business Administration, 8 except that the Small Business Administration shall 9 not have any authority to carry out any verification 10 functions of the Center for Verification and Evalua-11 tion; and

12 (2) on the transfer date, be functions of the13 Small Business Administration.

14 (c) TRANSFER OF ASSETS.—So much of the per-15 sonnel, property, and records employed, used, held, avail-16 able, or to be made available in connection with a function 17 transferred under this section shall be available to the 18 Small Business Administration at such time or times as 19 the President directs for use in connection with the func-20 tions transferred.

(d) REFERENCES.—Any reference in any other Federal law, Executive order, rule, regulation, or delegation
of authority, or any document of or pertaining to a function of the Center for Verification and Evaluation that is

transferred under this section is deemed, after the transfer
 date, to refer to the Small Business Administration.

3 SEC. 9. REPORT.

4 Not later than the end of the 1-year period beginning 5 on the date of the enactment of this Act, and every 6 months thereafter until the transfer date, the Adminis-6 7 trator of the Small Business Administration and Secretary 8 of Veterans Affairs shall jointly issue a report to the Com-9 mittees on Appropriations, Small Business, and Veterans' 10 Affairs of the House of Representatives and the Committees on Appropriations, Small Business and Entrepreneur-11 12 ship, and Veterans' Affairs of the Senate on the planning 13 for the transfer of functions and property required under this Act and the amendments made by this Act on the 14 15 transfer date. Such report shall include—

- (1) whether and how the verification database
 and operations of the Center for Verification and
 Evaluation of the Department of Veterans Affairs
 will be incorporated into the existing certification
 database of the Small Business Administration;
- 21 (2) projections for the numbers and timing, in
 22 terms of fiscal year, of—
- 23 (A) already verified concerns that will24 come up for recertification; and

1	(B) self-certified concerns that are ex-
2	pected to apply for certification;
3	(3) an explanation of how outreach to veteran
4	service organizations, the service-disabled veteran-
5	owned and veteran-owned small business community,
6	and other stakeholders will be conducted; and
7	(4) other pertinent information determined by
8	the Administrator and the Secretary.
9	SEC. 10. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.
10	The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of
11	complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go-Act of 2010,
