AN ACT

APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND WELFARE FOR THE DIVISIONS OF INDEPENDENT COUNCILS, INDIRECT SUPPORT SERVICES, HEALTHCARE POLICY INITIATIVES AND LICENSING AND CERTIFICATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018; LIMITING THE NUMBER OF AUTHORIZED FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITIONS; PROVIDING FOR GENERAL FUND TRANSFERS TO THE COOPERATIVE WELFARE FUND; DIRECTING EXPENDITURES FOR TRUSTEE AND BENEFIT PAYMENTS; PROVIDING LEGISLATIVE INTENT FOR PROGRAM INTEGRITY; REQUIRING A REPORT ON THE USE OF VOCA FUNDS; DIRECTING MONTHLY MEDICAID TRACKING REPORTS; REQUIRING BIENNIAL REPORTS FOR THE MEDICAID PROGRAM INTEGRITY UNIT COLLECTIONS; DIRECTING PROGRAM TRANSFER REPORTS; REQUIRING A MONTHLY REPORT ON DEPARTMENT VACANCIES; REPORTING ON IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SHIP GRANT; REQUIRING QUARTERLY REPORTS ON FACILITY LICENSING AND CERTIFICATION; APPROPRIATING ADDITIONAL MONEYS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND WELFARE FOR INDIRECT SUPPORT SERVICES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017; REDUCING THE APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND WELFARE FOR INDIRECT SUPPORT SERVICES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of Health and Welfare, the following amounts to be expended according to the designated divisions, programs and expense classes, from the listed funds for the period July 1, 2017, through June 30, 2018:

SECTION 2. FTP AUTHORIZATION. In accordance with Section 67-3519, Idaho Code, each of the divisions in the Department of Health and Welfare listed below is authorized no more than the number of full-time equivalent positions at any point during the period July 1, 2017, through June 30, 2018, unless specifically authorized by the Governor. The Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee will be notified promptly of any increased positions so authorized. Further, notwithstanding any other provision of law, it is the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Health and Welfare has the authority to transfer authorized full-time equivalent positions between budgeted programs.

SECTION 3. GENERAL FUND TRANSFERS. As appropriated, the State Comptroller shall make transfers from the General Fund to the Cooperative Welfare Fund, periodically, as requested by the director of the Department of Health and Welfare and approved by the Board of Examiners.

SECTION 4. TRUSTEE AND BENEFIT PAYMENTS. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 67-3511, Idaho Code, funds budgeted in the trustee and benefit payments expenditure class shall not be transferred to any other expense classes during fiscal year 2018.

SECTION 5. PROGRAM INTEGRITY. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, it is hereby declared to be the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Health and Welfare shall be required to provide those services authorized or mandated by law in each program, only to the extent of funding and available resources appropriated for each budgeted program.

SECTION 6. REPORTING ON USE OF ADDITIONAL VOCA FUNDS. The Domestic Violence Council shall provide a report to the Legislative Services Office and the Division of Financial Management that describes the status of the addi-

1 tional federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funds that were appropriated in  
2 fiscal year 2017. These funds were provided to the council by the federal  
3 government with little notice and at an amount that more than doubled the  
4 normal distribution. The format of the report, and the information included  
5 therein, shall be determined by the Legislative Services Office and the Di-  
6 vision of Financial Management. The report shall be provided no later than  
7 December 31, 2017.

8 SECTION 7. MEDICAID TRACKING REPORT. The Department of Health and Wel-  
9 fare, Medicaid Division and Indirect Support Services Division, shall de-  
10 liver on a monthly basis to the Legislative Services Office and the Division  
11 of Financial Management a report that compares the Medicaid budget as appro-  
12 priated, distributed by month for the year, to actual expenditures and re-  
13 maining forecasted expenditures for the year. The report shall also include  
14 a forecast, updated monthly, of the next fiscal year's anticipated trustee  
15 and benefit expenditures. The format of the report, and the information in-  
16 cluded therein, shall be determined by the Legislative Services Office and  
17 the Division of Financial Management.

18 SECTION 8. MEDICAID PROGRAM INTEGRITY COLLECTIONS. It is the intent of  
19 the Legislature that the Indirect Support Services Division provide reports  
20 biannually to the Legislative Services Office and the Division of Financial  
21 Management comparing the total costs from all funding sources used for the  
22 Medicaid Program Integrity Unit and the collections related to those ef-  
23 forts. The format of the report, and the information included therein, shall  
24 be determined by the Legislative Services Office and the Division of Finan-  
25 cial Management. The first report is to contain information from July 1,  
26 2017, through December 31, 2017, and shall be submitted no later than January  
27 15, 2018, and the second report shall include information from January 1,  
28 2018, through June 30, 2018, as well as information for the entire year, and  
29 shall be submitted by June 30, 2018, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

30 SECTION 9. PROGRAM TRANSFER REPORT. The Department of Health and Wel-  
31 fare, Indirect Support Services Division, shall provide to the Legislative  
32 Services Office and the Division of Financial Management three (3) reports,  
33 with each report providing information that compares the department budget,  
34 as appropriated, to the estimated expenditures of the department for each  
35 budget unit to include: transfers of FTP authority between and among budget  
36 units; transfers of appropriation, by fund, between and among budget units;  
37 and transfers of funds by expense class between and among budget units. The  
38 first report shall be submitted no later than December 1, 2017, the second  
39 report shall be submitted no later than March 1, 2018, and the third report  
40 shall be submitted by June 1, 2018.

41 SECTION 10. VACANCY REPORT. On a monthly basis, the Department of  
42 Health and Welfare, Indirect Support Services Division, shall provide to the  
43 Legislative Services Office and the Division of Financial Management a staff  
44 vacancy report that compares filled positions to authorized positions for  
45 each budgeted program. The format of the report, and information contained

1 therein, shall be determined by the Legislative Services Office and the Di-  
2 vision of Financial Management.

3 SECTION 11. REPORTING ON IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SHIP GRANT. On an annual  
4 basis, the Healthcare Policy Initiatives Program shall report the status of  
5 the State Healthcare Innovation Plan (SHIP) to the Legislative Services Of-  
6 fice and the Division of Financial Management. The report shall include com-  
7 ments and suggestions from private insurers, private providers, and other  
8 active stakeholders on the process of moving from the current fee-for-ser-  
9 vice medical model to a capitated model of healthcare delivery. The report  
10 shall also include results of any performance metrics required by the grant,  
11 in addition to updates on potential solutions for the State of Idaho. This  
12 report shall be submitted no later than December 31, 2017.

13 SECTION 12. REQUIRING BIENNIAL REPORTS ON FACILITY LICENSING AND CER-  
14 TIFICATION. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Health  
15 and Welfare, Licensing and Certification Program, provide biannual reports  
16 to the Legislative Services Office and the Division of Financial Management  
17 on the status of facility licensing and certifications as well as staff  
18 workload and caseload issues. For the past several years, the program has  
19 noted staffing issues related to retention, which in turn has created a large  
20 backlog of facility inspections and licensures. The format of the report,  
21 and the information included therein, shall be determined by the Legislative  
22 Services Office and the Division of Financial Management. The first report  
23 shall be submitted no later than December 31, 2017, and the second report  
24 shall be submitted no later than June 30, 2018.

25 SECTION 13. In addition to the appropriation made in Section 1, Chapter  
26 312, Laws of 2016, and any other appropriation provided for by law, there is  
27 hereby appropriated \$1,360,000 from the Cooperative Welfare (Federal) Fund  
28 to the Department of Health and Welfare, for Indirect Support Services, to be  
29 expended for personnel costs, for the period July 1, 2016, through June 30,  
30 2017.

31 SECTION 14. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary,  
32 the appropriation made to the Department of Health and Welfare, for Indirect  
33 Support Services, in Section 1, Chapter 312, Laws of 2016, from the Cooper-  
34 ative Welfare (General) Fund, is hereby reduced by \$244,900 for personnel  
35 costs, for the period July 1, 2016, through June 30, 2017.

36 SECTION 15. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby  
37 declared to exist, Sections 13 and 14 of this act shall be in full force and  
38 effect on and after passage and approval.
