- WHEREAS, epilepsy is a neurological disorder caused by irregular cell activity in
- 3 the brain; and
- 4 WHEREAS, each year, roughly 150,000 Americans are diagnosed with epilepsy;

- 6 WHEREAS, 3.4 million Americans, and more than 50,000 Kentuckians, suffer
- 7 from epilepsy; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the symptoms of epilepsy can be severe and debilitating, and include
- 9 seizures, uncontrollable twitching, and periodic loss of awareness; and
- WHEREAS, although epilepsy is most commonly diagnosed in those under 20
- 11 years old, the rate of new cases greatly increases after age 55; and
- WHEREAS, even though awareness and advocacy have improved, epilepsy remains
- a vastly misunderstood disorder, and epilepsy sufferers are often stigmatized and isolated;

- WHEREAS, in spite of these obstacles, epileptics can live productive lives and
- 16 contribute in myriad ways to daily life; and
- WHEREAS, in 2002, National Epilepsy Awareness Month was designated in the
- 18 United States, and on this day the members of this august body recognize that important
- 19 event here in this Commonwealth; and
- WHEREAS, in so doing, the members on this day urge all Kentuckians to ensure
- 21 that people with epilepsy, especially those living in the underserved parts of the
- 22 Commonwealth, are provided with the care that they need to live productive, fulfilling
- 23 lives;
