- 3 WHEREAS, on March 12, 1912, Girl Scouts was founded by Juliette Gordon Low with the
- 4 inaugural gathering of 18 girls in her hometown of Savannah, Georgia; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Juliette's extraordinary journey began more than 100 years ago when she
- 6 organized the very first Girl Scout troop in Savannah, Georgia; and
- 7 WHEREAS, her life's mission was to prepare girls to face the world with courage,
- 8 confidence, and character and to make the world a better place in which to live; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts of Historic Georgia and Girl Scouts of Greater Atlanta are
- 10 composed of 74,500 girls and adults who believe in the power of every G.I.R.L. (Go-getter,
- 11 Innovator, Risk-taker, Leader)TM to change the world; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts is recognized as a national and world leader in providing the best
- 13 leadership development experience for girls; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts brings time-tested methods and research programs backed by more
- 15 than 100 years of experience and expertise in the field, which speak to the strengths of
- 16 leadership development in the lives of girls; and
- 17 WHEREAS, in Girl Scouts, girls are able to develop their leadership potential through
- activities which enable them to discover their values, their skills, and the world around them

- 22 invaluable life skills by helping all girls to take the lead early and often; and

- 24 Award Girl Scout by engaging in leadership at the highest levels while addressing an issue

- 26 WHEREAS, the Girl Scout Gold Award, the highest honor a Girl Scout can earn,
- 27 acknowledges each recipient's power and dedication to not only bettering herself but to
- 28 making the world a better place for others; and
- 29 WHEREAS, over the course of the past 106 years, Girl Scouts has positively impacted more
- 30 than 50 million American women who are Girl Scout alumnae as well as 2.6 million girls and
- 31 adult volunteers who are active members; and
- 32 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that founder Juliette Gordon Low and Girl
- 33 Scouts be appropriately recognized for the significant impact that they have had on girls
- 34 throughout the state and nation.

- 36 the members of this body recognize Girl Scouts on the grand occasion of its 106th
- anniversary.
