A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to acquire approximately 44 acres of land in Martinez, California, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “John Muir National
5 Historic Site Expansion Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. JOHN MUIR NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE LAND ACQUI-**
2 **SITION.**

3 (a) ACQUISITION.—The Secretary of the Interior may
4 acquire by donation the approximately 44 acres of land,
5 and interests in such land, that are identified on the map
6 entitled “John Muir National Historic Site Proposed
7 Boundary Expansion”, numbered 426/127150, and dated
8 November, 2014.

9 (b) BOUNDARY.—Upon the acquisition of the land
10 authorized by subsection (a), the Secretary of the Interior
11 shall adjust the boundaries of the John Muir Historic Site
12 in Martinez, California, to include the land identified on
13 the map referred to in subsection (a).

14 (c) ADMINISTRATION.—The land and interests in
15 land acquired under subsection (a) shall be administered
16 as part of the John Muir National Historic Site estab-
17 lished by the Act of August 31, 1964 (Public Law 88–
18 547; 78 Stat. 753; 16 U.S.C. 461 note).

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
